WORLD SHORTHORN CONFERENCE

"MEATING THE FUTURE"

The Australian Shorthorn Family invites you to the 2019 World Conference & Tour.

The Pre-Conference tour starts Monday 23rd September 2019 with 3 nights in Adelaide, during this time you will view Bayview Stud, Bundaleer Stud & Carlton Stud.

While in SA the home of some of Australia's best wine, you will visit one of the oldest & best wineries, Yalumba (Est 1849)

From here you will travel to Mt Gambier via Belmore Stud. You will be spending 2 nights in Mt Gambier visiting Shepherd's Noola Stud & the famous Blue Lakes at Mt Gambier.

The tour will then proceed to Ballarat Victoria, visiting the Eloora Stud & Rockgrove Stud. Following this will be the Royal Melbourne Show, with the Shorthorn judging taking place



Sunday September 29th 2019. 2 dairy herds in the Gippsland district will be visited, followed by a visit to the world-famous Phillip Island Penguin Parade.

From Melbourne we travel to Griffith (NSW) viewing a restored heritage wool shed at the Tataila Stud near Echuca on the Murray River.

Near Griffith we will visit a JBS feedlot where the Thousand Guineas Shorthorns are fed. We then travel to Wagga Wagga via Spry's Stud where the 2 day conference (3rd & 4th October 2019) will be held at the Charles Sturt University. With 'Meating the Future' as our theme, Excellent speakers & lively (we hope) discussions & a visit to the University Veterinary School being organised.

Following Wagga Wagga the post conference tour will feature The Shorthorn Youth Expo being held in Dubbo which includes their annual Heifer Show.

Other Studs are then visited on the way to Sydney via Coonabarabran & Tamworth.



The tour will conclude with a Sydney Harbour cruise & final dinner on Thursday 10th October 2019.

A further post conference tour will follow in Tasmania for 4 nights.

SHORTHORN SALE RESULTS

NATIONAL VIDEO SALE

Shorthorn was part of the National Video Sale held in Palmerston North on the 14th May.

Five vendors entered 8 Bulls which were videoed for the sale but remained at the vendor's property.

Four sold at the Video auction to a top price of \$11,000. Longview Meatpacker 16062 on account of S & D Dromgool was purchased by Ody Bros. C Stewart and R Proffit also made purchases.

Overall the sale was well attended but perhaps lacked strong commercial support.

TAHUNA & HIWIROA BULL SALE

We held our first on Farm Video Bull Sale at Flemington on June 7th. The new format worked well and we sold 8 of the 10 Bulls penned. Six sold for a top of \$5,000 and an average of \$4,700.

MORTON SHORTHORNS BULL SALE

8 out of 11 Bulls sold average \$5,916, 4 sold to stud. Thank you for all our clients support.

RAUPUHA SHORTHORNS

Sold 7 of the 11 bulls offered average \$5,500. Highest price \$7,000 to Bullock Creek Station.

HINEWAKA BULL SALE

A successful sale on June 6th saw 15 bulls sell for an average of \$6,200.

Top price was \$20,000 for Lot 2 Hinewaka Balance 72/16 purchased by Colvend Stud, the Park family and Hiwiroa Stud, the Syme family. Two other stud bulls sold, lot 5, Hinewaka Target 69/16 to Hamish Brown for \$12,500 and lot 15, Hinewaka Bal 30/16 to Anita Erskine for \$4,500.

ROUGH RIDGE BULL SALE

9 out of 10 sold. Highest price \$8,500 with an average of \$4,833

LONGVIEW BULL SALE

11 bulls sold with an average of \$7,300 and 35 heifers with an average of \$1,800.

ADLs - Thanks to all those breeders who have returned their ADLs (Active Dam List). If you haven't, please get it to me ASAP.

2018 Calf Registrations - These can be completed either online through Internet Solutions or on paper forms which have been posted out. Please contact me if you need help or require further information.

DNA for sires – Please ensure you take samples from joining sires at mating. Sires must have a DNA profile before any calves by them can be registered.

Transfers – For any animals sold to stud a signed transfer form needs to be completed and sent to me to process. Transfer forms can be found on the Shorthorn website under 'Download Forms' or I can post/email a copy. Registration certificates for transferred animals are available on request.

Monthly group run – Data to be included needs to be with me by the 10th of every month.
