I started Carriganes Cattle in 2010 with the purchase of three in-calf Angus cows. After a few years breeding, I decided to branch into Shorthorn after spending two days in a car with a well-respected NZ breeder, Bill Austin, who very easily twisted my arm to the red, white, and roan world of the Shorthorn cattle. My herd is small with Shorthorn, Angus and Shorthorn Angus cross cattle. I am breeding for meat quality as my key trait, beginning with

intramuscular fat followed by eye muscle area, and rib and rump fat. Birth weight with moderate growth rates are important, always looking for breeding values at breed average or better to continually be improving my herd and the breed in general. I enjoy the challenge of selecting genetics that will improve on what I have, alongside ensuring my stock are structurally sound and not too big for our flat, easy, country farm.

LOCHBURN SHORTHORN

Kelvin Stokes



My parents Arnold and Lillian Stokes purchased their first Shorthorn cattle in the mid 1960's and registered their stud as Lochabar.

When I took over part of the operation I registered my stud as Lochburn. Part of the farms operation was also dairy farming.

Before 2000 I was predominantly running a commercial herd whilst keeping records of the calves and

their parentage. I then upgraded the herd where possible and registered the cattle. My breeding is now all stud animals.

In 2003 I ceased dairy farming.

I initially increased the breeding cows to 140 and now back to 100 as I no longer have access to additional lease land nearby for raising offspring for fattening cattle.

GLENROSSIE SHORTHORN

Will, David and Tracy Ody



Glenrossie Beef Shorthorn and Santa Gertrudis stud was established in 1969 and recently celebrated its 50th anniversary. Brothers Brian and Will Ody purchased the original six stud Loch females from Malcolm Anderson, along with the imported bull, Burnton Banter.

Top AI sires from Australia were used for many years, as well as imported bulls Belmore Blotch (Aus) and Nepowie Oley (Aus). AI has continued for 50 years, with bulls from Australia and Canada being used.

The Santa Gertrudis herd started in the mid 1970s when AI from King Ranch became available to New Zealand. The Santas were bred up from the Shorthorn herd, again with AI being used ever since, mostly from Australian Santa bulls.

The property is located on the seaward side of Mt Manaia at Whangarei Heads and has been in the family since 1906, when the first Ody settlers arrived shortly after emigrating from England.

The original block was around 600 acres and was cleared and used as a dairy operation until 1980, when the change was made to sheep and beef. Neighbouring blocks of land have been purchased over the years, with the farm now 1200 acres, ranging from low lying flats to steep rocky mountain. The soils are clay, peat, sand and red volcanic over limestone. The aim of the stud is to produce structurally sound, well fleshed, fast growing bulls for commercial beef breeders.

Structure, conformation and muscle are important traits for profitable beef cattle in the New Zealand grass fed production system and the purpose of the breeding programme at the stud has never changed. The Ody family welcome visitors to the stud and have hosted many tours over the years, we are always happy to showcase our cattle and property. We are excited about the future and the challenges that farming will face in the coming years.

Mill Valley Shorthorns is in Eastern Taranaki, Pohokura, 50kms east of Stratford near Whangamomona. We have been farming in the area for eight years with our two daughters, Ruby (7) and Lucy (4). Having both grown up on sheep and beef properties, farming is something that we are really passionate about. The Mill Valley Shorthorn stud started

in 2017 by purchasing five in-calf heifers from Orena and Corsock/Colvend and five in-calf cows from Raupuha. We were grateful to then have the opportunity to purchase Waimai cows from Helen and the late John Reeves. It is a real honour to be able to continue their bloodlines into the next generation of NZ Shorthorns. Currently we now have 24 stud

animals to calve in the 2019 season with the first due mid-August. Alongside our Shorthorn and commercial cattle, we also run about 900 ewes, including a small Wiltshire sheep stud. These lambs are recorded and the majority of the rams sold as 2ths.

WESTWOOD SHORTHORN



A Family Farm run by three siblings. Anita Erskine is the owner of the Westwood Shorthorn Stud Cattle and Coloured Sheep. Her two brothers, Quinton & Eric own the Commercial Purebred Shorthorn Cattle and White Sheep.



Effective/Grass = 365ha (901 acres), Rough grazing and scrub = 90ha (222 acres) giving us a Total of 455ha (1123 acres)



Flat to easy rolling, with the odd steeper parts.



60-year average at Westwood Farm is 1237.2mm (49.49 inches), wettest year in the last 60 years was 2002 with 1560mm (62.4 inches) and driest year in the last 60 years was 1974 with 857mm (34.28 inches).



Romney white sheep: 2700 in lamb ewes, 740 ewe hoggets and 30 rams. Coloured Sheep: 55 in lamb ewes (both Romney & Corriedale), 15 ewe hoggets and 2 rams. Commercial Purebred Shorthorns include 83 in calf cows & heifers, Approximately 80 R1 Bull, Steers and Heifers. Westwood Stud Shorthorns include 45 in calf cows & heifers, Approximately 40 R1 bulls, steers and heifers. There are also three breeding bulls.

The Erskine Family have been farming in Papatotara for four generations with the original block leased in 1885 then purchased from the crown. In 1997 and 2016 another three blocks were added. It is a family farm that has been passed down through the generations, with three siblings running it at the moment, which can cause a few challenges, but we all get along very well. Decisions are made by everyone putting in their penny's worth, then you mix it up and the result is often a mixture of

everyone's ideas. In the 1930s a mob of all sorts of cows and a Shorthorn bull were purchased. But it wasn't until the early 1950s that a mob of Purebred Shorthorn cows were purchased at a clearing sale. This was the start of the purebred Shorthorns at Westwood and it is a breed that has served us well. All cattle that are not kept as a replacement or sold for breeding, are sent to the works between the age of 18 and 21 months, with the aim to have cull heifers doing a carcass weight of at least 250kgs,

the steers doing a carcass weight of at least 285kgs and the cull bulls doing a carcass weight of at least 325kgs. In the mid-1990s Anita decided she would like to have a Shorthorn stud, so some of the commercial AI bred cattle were inspected for registration and some stud cows from the Austin's were purchased. Over the years cows have been purchased from a variety of studs. With both the stud and commercial mob the aim is to have easy doing cattle that will thrive in all conditions.



How and when you sell your bulls:

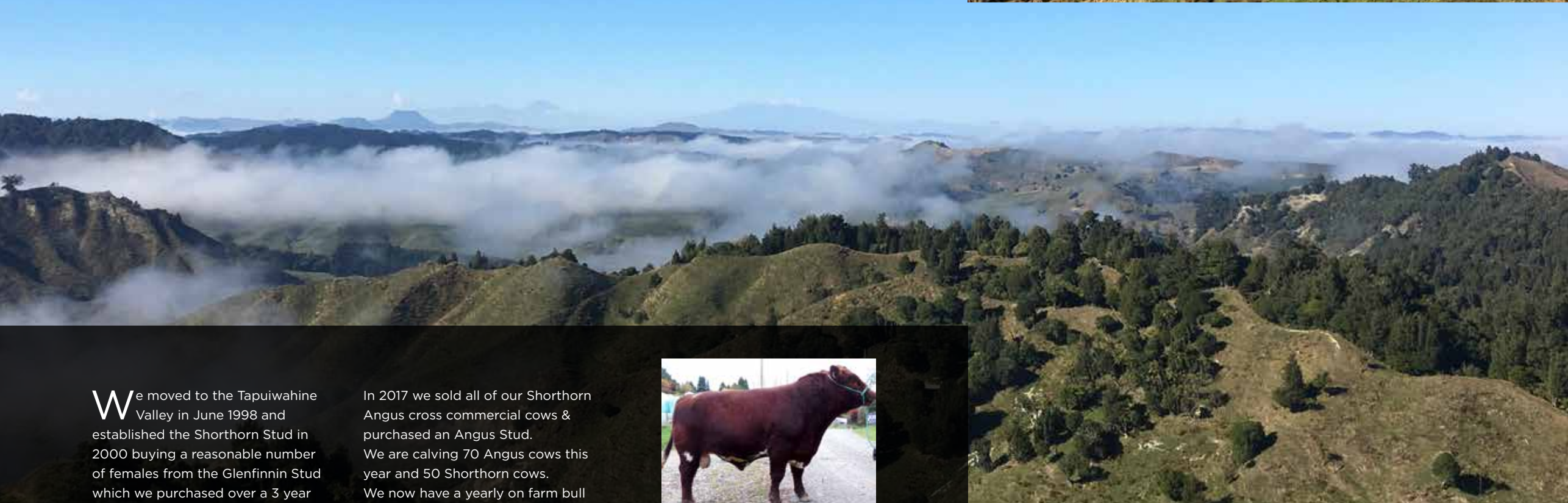

We moved to the Tapuiwahine Valley in June 1998 and established the Shorthorn Stud in 2000 buying a reasonable number of females from the Glenfinnin Stud which we purchased over a 3 year period. These Shorthorns were the foundation of our stud. We also purchased females from these Studs Rungahiwi, Naumai and Austins over the years. In 2013-2015 we had Champion Shorthorn bulls at Beef Expo Show and Sale.

In 2017 we sold all of our Shorthorn Angus cross commercial cows & purchased an Angus Stud. We are calving 70 Angus cows this year and 50 Shorthorn cows. We now have a yearly on farm bull auction of R2 year old bulls in May. We also have a flock of commercial Romney ewes and Suffolk & Dorset Down Stud selling rams yearly and fatten all surplus lambs.

Raupuha Shorthorns was started in 1972 by my father Jeff purchasing in-calf heifers from Ian Thompson of Putaruru. Mum & Dad farmed them on steep hill country east of Stratford until 1996 then moved them to easier country 10 minutes out of Te Kuiti before moving to Mahoenui in 2003. Mavis purchased some cows in 2007 before we took the cows and farm over in 2008. Over the last five years we have purchased some cows off John and Helen Reeves of Waimai Shorthorns. We generally run between 100 and 120 including mated 14month heifers. We are aiming to get our cow numbers down to 80 over the next five years as we get very wet over the winter/spring period. Our aim is to produce quality Shorthorn cattle with good structure and temperament, with balanced figures.

A big part of Raupuha Stud is to produce breeding 2th Rams for

commercial farmers all over New Zealand. We have a very big breeding programme for producing FE tolerant rams. This has been a very slow process. We have an on farm Ram sale the 3rd Tuesday of November each year.

Over the last three years we have undertaken a big development around our water ways and have fenced off over 25kms, with a lot of it planted with home grown native plants as, Mavis has developed her own native Nursery. Mavis has just started selling them now. Raupuha Stud is always open for anyone to call in and have a look. We really enjoy opening our part of paradise up to anyone from around the world.

Hiwiroa Shorthorns was established with the purchase of 25 cows from the Ryedale herd in 2005. We soon developed a working relationship with Timothy Plummers' Tahuna herd, where while retaining separate ownership the herds are run together. We have added cows from the Tahuna, Pinnacle, Austins and Brigadoon herds as well as breeding up from our own herd to where we now have 80 calving cows. This year we have had 12 Embryo Transfer calves born and see this as the best way to further grow our herd utilizing

proven performers in our own environment. For the past 12 years we have focused on selecting sires with higher fats and EMA for carcass quality, with good growth but maintaining positive calving ease and a moderate frame which we believe gives us a functional cow herd to handle the tough times and excel when conditions are favorable. The Mature cow herd is farmed on medium to steep coastal hill country at Porangahau on a property we purchased in March 2019 and in calf

heifers and bulls are grown out at Hiwiroa. The cattle are farmed alongside a commercial flock of 1400 ewes. Farming on the summer dry east coast we have been endeavoring to add more flexibility to our farming system over this time. With the purchase of the new coastal block we will move to putting more ewes to a terminal sire targeting the pre Christmas premiums but will have to buy in some of our replacements.

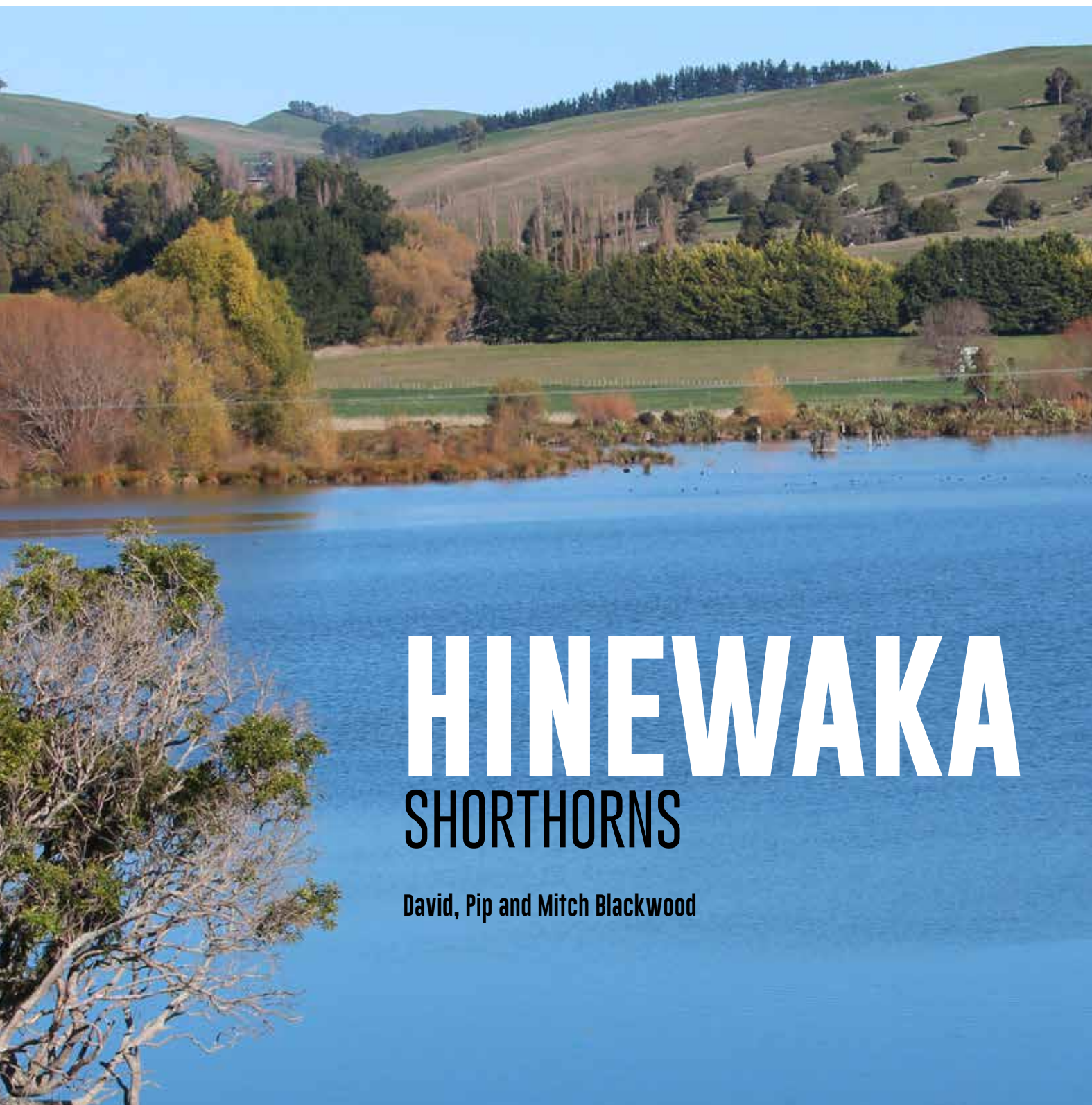

Hinewaka is a 780 Ha hill country property, 20kms south-east of Masterton, in the Gladstone district. David and Pip are the fifth generation on the family farm and Shorthorns have been part of the cattle operation since the very first days of farming the property, dating back to the 1850s.

Son, Mitch, is now back on the farm with his partner, Morgan, and their two young girls, Isla and Imogen. Being on the east coast of the North Island, the property is predominantly summer dry. Most years all surplus lambs are fattened directly to the meat processors. Lucerne and fodder crops are used widely. At an altitude

of up to 500m a.s.l, the winters can be quite limiting and snow is not uncommon. Most years, cattle are wintered on crops and fed baleage. The main objective of the breeding programme is to be commercially focused and breed cattle that will add real value to other farmers operations.

How and when you sell your bulls:

Each year an on-farm sale is held in the first week of June. 20-25 bulls are on offer and most bulls are sold to commercial operations in the North Island.

Past Sires:

AI is used extensively in the herd. Originally sires were used from America and Canada, but more recently predominantly Australian sires have been used. Sires to have a major impact have been Sprys Patents Ace, Outback Sprys Balance and Hinewaka Wagman 21.

Sires for 2020:

2020s bull sale will be held June 3rd. Sires represented in the sale will be Royalla Rembrandt K413 and Sprys on Target H189. New sire - Yamburgan Anzac L278 will have sons for sale in 2021.

TURIWHATE SHORTHORN STUD

Chris and I manage the Turiwhate Farm which lies on the banks of the Taramakau River, about 10 minutes inland from Kumara. We run a commercial Hereford and Cross bred herd, finish all their progeny as well as breeding our own replacement heifers and bulls to go over the family dairy herds. We became interested in Shorthorns after observing their performance, particularly as a crossbred cow, in our commercial herd. The benefits and potential that the breed has excited us to begin the Stud. Turiwhate Shorthorn Stud was established in 2017 with cows from the former Brigadoon Stud and embryos from Sprys Shorthorns (Australia). Since then we have added extra heifers to steadily build our numbers.

This season we are calving 20 Shorthorn cows and heifers as well as expecting embryos from a previous flush. We started Glendhu Shorthorns in 1995 and today the herd is made up of 60 Stud cows. The cows are all run 45km away at our Lawrence farm on steep hard terrain. Here the cows are run under very commercial conditions, there is no supplementary feeding and the cows are made to work to manage undeveloped pasture. At weaning all the calves are brought

back to our Heriot property. The heifer calves are mated at 15 mths of age and calved at Heriot before heading to Lawrence post calving. The Bulls are wintered on swedes and hay, and are all run in one mob for their life. Our breeding emphasis is on producing structurally sound bulls that are soft, easy doing with good temperament. EBVs play an

important role in our selection as we aim to have moderate birth sires with good growth, plenty of muscle and fat, while maintaining the strong maternal attributes of the Shorthorn breed. We also run three sheep studs Coopworth, Romney and Dorset Down Studs and sell around 200 Rams per year through out the South Island.

How and when you sell your bulls:

We sell our bulls on farm at Public Auction. 2019 was our first sale with a full clearance of bulls averaging \$6136. This takes place annually in mid May.

Past Sires:

We have extensively used AI historically with good success. Weebollabolla Theodore has played a huge role in our herd. Also Marrellan Super Dazzler, Weebollabolla Waratah and Sprys All Gold have bred well for us. More recently we have been using NZ Sires with Hinewaka Genetics being heavily used over the past 3 seasons with good results

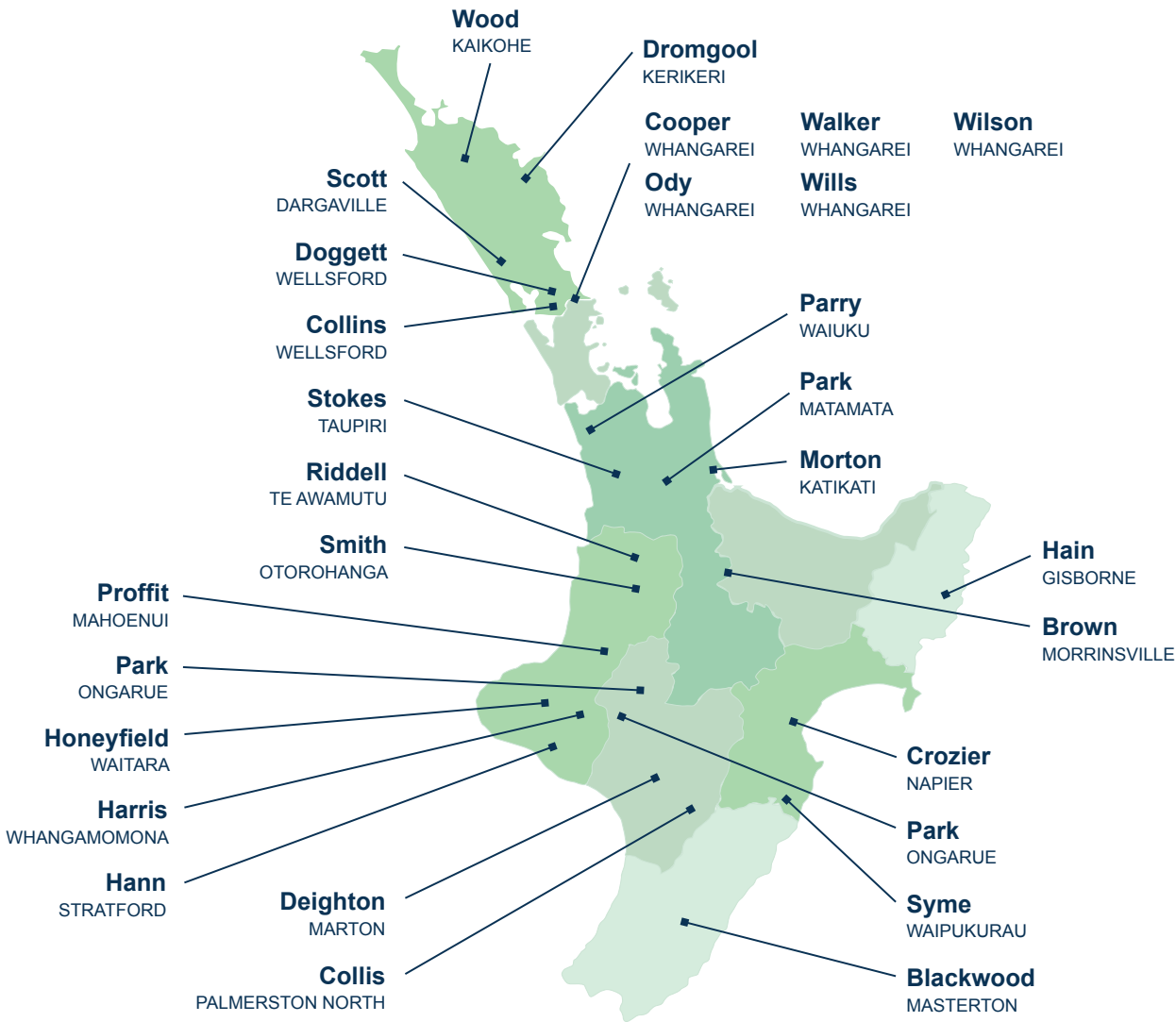

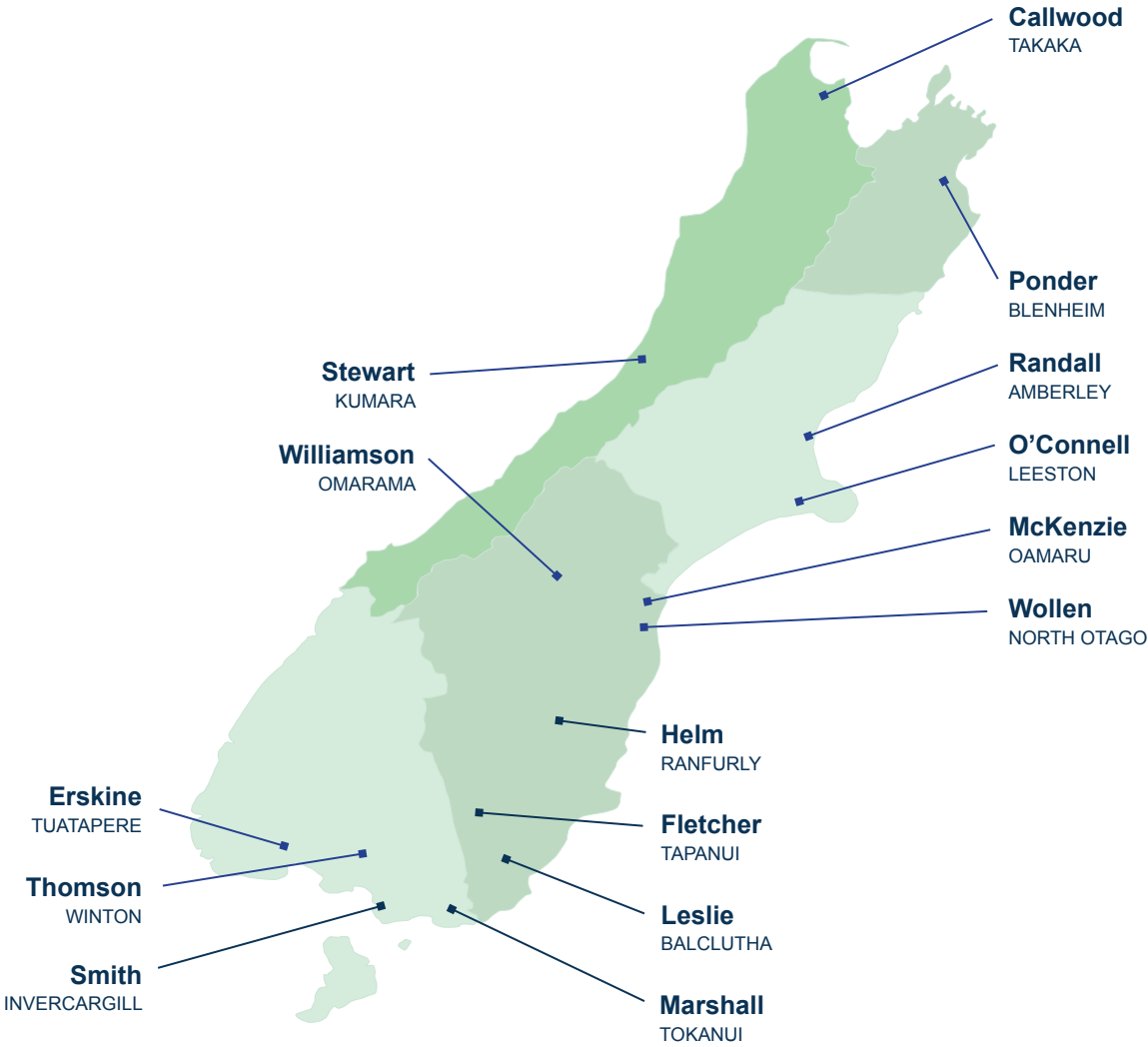
