

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Another year is just about over and you're ready to sit back and reflect on 2022, which has been interesting. One word that I can think of to describe it is challenging. The best thing we can do is stay positive and worry about what we can control and an important part of this for our breed is breeding quality cattle that we can sell to the NZ farmers.

As a council we have been investigating ways to improve the breed moving forward. We have a very unique opportunity coming up partnering with Beef + Lamb Genetics in a commercial Beef Progeny trial to be run at Bevan Proffit's property on State Highway 4, halfway between Whanganui and Raetihi. 135 heifers and 220 cows will be synchronized and fixed time Al to 250 Shorthorn straws from six bulls. We also have a mix of 100 straws from six well linked Angus and Hereford bulls that will be used on the remainder of the cows. These six bulls have been well used in the industry. Shorthorn, Angus and Hereford bulls will follow up after Al.

The heifers will be calved behind a wire and birth weight, calving ease, etc. recorded. Cows will calve out on the hill as per normal farming policy. Calves will all be DNA tested, have 200, 400, 600 day weights; EMA, Fats and IMF; and Temperament recorded. Heifer calves will be mated as yearlings back to Shorthorn, Angus and Herefords. The following two calvings and matings will be recorded. Steer calves get EMA, Fats and IMF recorded then killed and all carcass data recorded.

As a council we believe this will be a great opportunity to benchmark the breed. We will be doing three matings so are really looking for all members to support this with semen or bulls in the future.

This will be a great topic for discussion at the upcoming AGM in Christchurch.

We are also having a lot of discussion around IGS and ABRI. This is a big issue for the breed and the 2023 AGM has been set down as the date to make a decision on it. We will have an all-member vote on this decision the week after the AGM. The most important thing is, this decision, which ever way it goes, will not be everyone's choice. We all need to support the final vote and that all members had the right to vote on this topic and move forward as a breed together for us to maintain the breed as a viable choice for the NZ beef industry.

I'm looking forward to catching up with everyone at the 2023 herd tour to be held in Canterbury/West Coast area. We are visiting some studs and an impressive commercial operation which purchase and fatten a lot of Shorthorn cattle.

Merry Christmas and Happy New Year and looking forward to an amazing 2023.

- Any sire being used for the purpose of AI outside of your own herd needs to be AI approved (ie. sold semen to another breeder)
- If you have, or plan to use Semen from an overseas animal, make sure he is registered on our Shorthorn database before registering your calves
